This week, a group of senior **LEGENDS** attended Matua Carsons whakatau as he began his new role in Puhoro. It was a privilege and honour to share in this special occasion with his whānau and for our **LEGENDS** past and present to share the impact he has had.



Rūma Iwa

Rūma Iwa has been exploring and learning about Tikanga Māori. Rūma Iwa has learnt that Tikanga Māori are guidelines for the appropriate way of doing things. We began by looking at the states of Tapu (sacredness, outlines restrictions and actions that are prohibited) and Noa (natural, peaceful state).

We learnt and discussed that although Tapu and Noa are opposite states, we can move from one state to the other by acknowledging certain practices.

During our learning, Rūma Iwa gained valuable insights around kai and Tikanga. Kai sits in the state of Noa and neutralises sacred energy and brings everyone into a settled state. Following this, we had a kōrero about Tikanga and kai and how we do not sit on tables or have any pieces of clothing on tables either. This is because our bodies are tapu, if we sit or put any items of clothing on tables it is mixing the two states.
