

Ruma tahi (Room 1)

Ruma Tahi (Room 1) have been looking at koru patterns as inspiration for our art. We used pastel as our choice of medium with the aim to blend colours together to create an effective piece of art. We looked at a variety of colour combinations and discussed which colours worked well together and which ones didn't. We then experimented with the technique of smudging, using pastels. Room tahi tamariki then needed to be **Rae Pakari (Determined)** and use their fingers to smudge 2 colours into each other, creating an effective blending effect. As you can see Ruma Tahi have displayed **Kairangi (Excellence)** with their choice of colour combinations to create a bright vibrant piece of art.
